I understand that there has been some confusion created over our proposed consultation of the above. You may have received a text message today informing you that the consultation is taking place this evening (Wednesday 10th February). This is not correct.

The consultation meeting will take place on Wednesday 24th February at 5pm. A Zoom link will be sent 24 hours prior to the meeting taking place.

Please accept my apologies for the confusion caused.

As a part of your child's education at Leytonstone School, we promote personal wellbeing and development through a comprehensive Personal, Social, Health, Relationship, Economic education programme. PSHRE education is the curriculum subject that gives young people the knowledge, understanding, attitudes and practical skills to live safe, healthy, productive lives and meet their full potential.

I am writing to let you know that as of September 2021, PSHERE lessons at the school will accommodate the new statutory government guidance on Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) and health education. RSE lessons in 2021 will include teaching pupils about: intimate and sexual relationships, including sexual health; keeping safe and the law; rights and risks surrounding online and media sources; respectful relationships, including friendships and how to live a healthy and balanced lifestyle.

Pupils will also have opportunities to ask questions which help prepare them for relationships of all kinds in the modern world. RSE education is taught throughout the school in every year group and is monitored and reviewed regularly by the staff and governing body.
