Each parent or carer is entitled to **one** vote, which should be returned to the school **by 17th February at noon**.

Alternatively, ballot slips are available from the school which can be put directly in the ballot box in the school office.

The voting paper will need to be sealed in an unmarked envelope which should then be sealed in an outer envelope marked "Parent Governor Elections" with your name. Once the name has been checked against the list of those eligible to vote, the outer envelope will be discarded and the inner envelope placed in the ballot box. We will also provide the envelopes.

If you intend to cast your vote in person, please call the school office beforehand so that you can be allocated a time and date to visit the school site. We are still in a national lockdown and must do all we can to minimize transmission of the virus.

You will find attached copies of the statements written by the three candidates stating why they wish to become parent governors; these will help you to cast your vote.
