For your Mock exams in June, you will be sitting English Language Paper 1 and English Literature Paper 2.

English Language Paper 1: Based on 1 Unseen Source, 5 questions
[80 marks]

- Q1-4 are Reading questions. **[40 marks]**
- Q5 asks you to write either a description based on an image. **[40 marks]**
- Or, a story based on a prompt title/ plot. **[40 marks]**

English Literature Paper 2: Poetry & *Animal Farm*, 4 questions
[96 marks]

- Section A: Answer **one** of two questions of *Animal Farm*. **[34 marks]**
- Section B: Compare the named poem from the Power and Conflict cluster to another of your choice based on the question. **[30 marks]**
- Section C: Analyse an unseen poem **[24 marks]**
- Section C: Compare the methods used in the unseen poem from above to another unseen poem **[8 marks]**

Below are 4 questions based on *Animal Farm*. **2** of these questions will appear in your upcoming Literature mock exam. Focus your revision on the following questions, revising characters and making essay plans for each.

1. 'Orwell creates a **shocking and unexpected ending** to *Animal Farm*.' How far do you agree with this statement?
Write about:
 - what happens towards the end of the novel.
 - how Orwell presents the ending.
2. How does Orwell use the character of **Snowball** to explore ideas about **leadership** in *Animal Farm*?
Write about:
 - what Snowball says and does and what happens to him
 - how Orwell presents Snowball.
3. How does Orwell use the character of **Squealer** to explore ideas about **truth** and lies in *Animal Farm*?
Write about:
 - what Squealer says and does.
 - how Orwell uses the character of Squealer to explore ideas about truth and lies.
4. How does Orwell use events in *Animal Farm* to explore ideas about **revolution**?
Write about:
 - some of the events in the book
 - how Orwell uses these events to explore ideas about revolution.
