

Your child will be supported by their form tutor/s, their Head of Year and also our Year 7 Pastoral Support staff.

We have seven form groups per year group, each with 30 pupils. The form group is at the heart of our family ethos at the school and where your child will begin to make lifelong connections and friendships.

More often than not, your child will find their form tutor to be one of their trusted adults at the school and someone who they can approach if they find they are having difficulty with a peer or another area of school life. All of our staff are trained in safeguarding and are aware of how to raise concerns with the Safeguarding Team at the school.

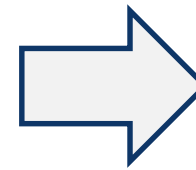

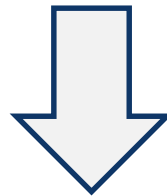

ParentPay®

All lunch payments are cashless; a ParentPay account will be setup for all pupils, which parents can top-up to enable pupils to purchase food at the till, using their fingerprint, or a purchasable payment card.

School trip and other payments can also be made through ParentPay.





Free School Meal (FSM) Eligibility

FSM are available to families in receipt of any of the following:

- Universal Credit (and an annual net income below £7,400)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on – paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

Staying Informed

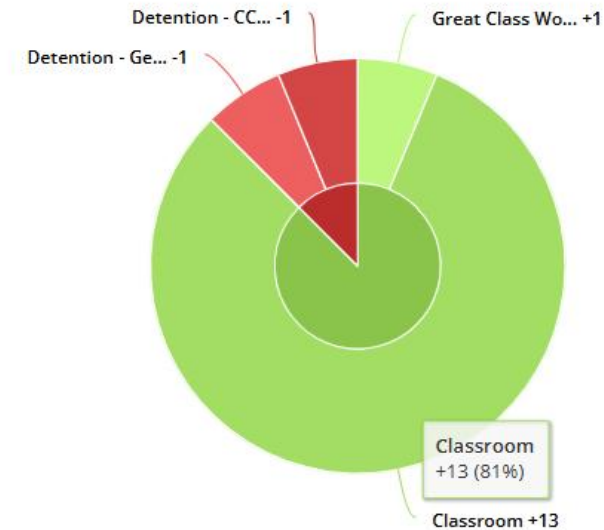
We encourage parents to keep fully up-to-date with their child's day-to-day activities and using the ClassCharts app.
